*I shall not die, but live, and declare the  
works of the LORD.*

*The LORD has chastened me severely,  
But He has not given me over to death.*

*Open to me the gates of righteousness; I will  
go through them, and I will praise the LORD.*

*This is the gate of the LORD, through  
which the righteous shall enter.*

*I will praise You, for You have answered  
me, and have become my salvation.*

*The stone which the builders rejected  
Has become the chief cornerstone.*

*This was the LORD's doing; it is  
marvelous in our eyes.*

*This is the day the LORD has made; we  
will rejoice and be glad in it.*

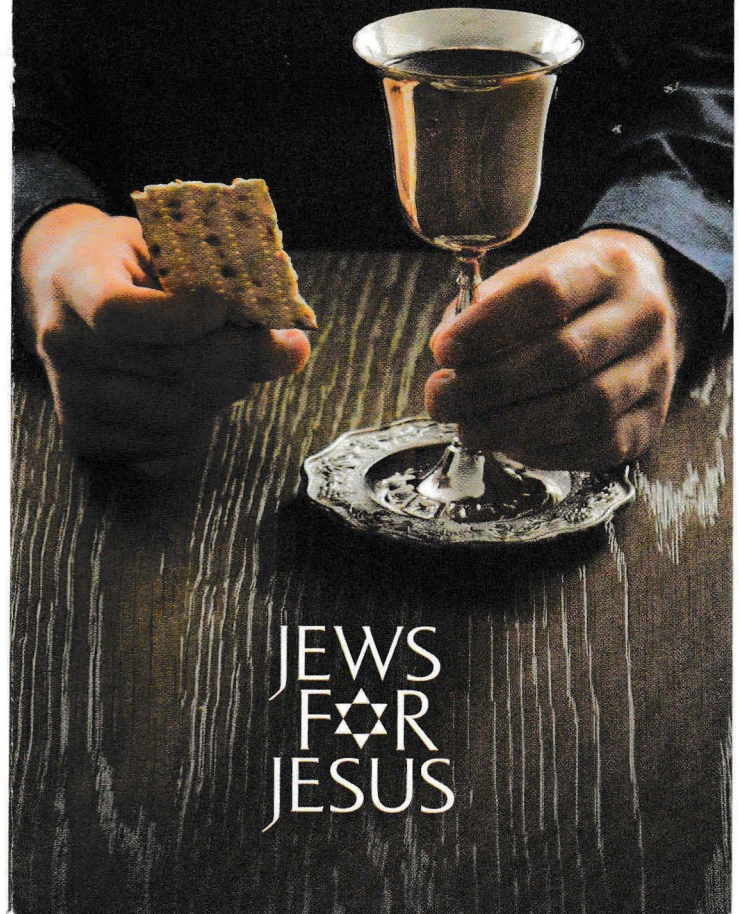

## The Four Questions

*Mah nish-ta-nah ha-lai-lah*

*ha-zeh mi-kol ha-lay-lot?*

- Why is this night different from all other nights? On all other nights we eat leavened or unleavened bread; why on this night do we eat only unleavened bread?
- On all other nights we eat vegetables and herbs of all kinds; why on this night do we eat only bitter herbs?
- On all other nights we are not required to dip the herbs once; why on this night do we dip them twice?
- On all other nights we eat sitting upright or reclining; why on this night do we recline?



## Blessing

### OVER THE CANDLES

Blessed art Thou, O Lord our God, King of the Universe, who sanctifies us by His commandments and commands us to kindle the festival lights.

### OVER THE CUP (KIDDUSH)

Blessed art Thou, O Lord our God, King of the Universe, who creates the fruit of the vine.

### OVER THE BREAD

Blessed art Thou, O Lord our God, King of the Universe, who brings forth bread from the earth.

## Glossary of Passover Terms

### FEAST OF UNLEAVENED BREAD

A seven-day feast that coincides with Passover, during which no leaven is to be eaten

**1. Chazeret:** the bitter root

**2. Chagigah:** roasted egg

**3. Karpas:** greens

**4. Maror:** bitter herb

**5. Charoset:** mixture of apples, cinnamon and nuts resembling mortar

**6. Z'roa:** shankbone of a lamb

**Haggadah:** service book, literally "the telling"

**Afikomen:** "that which comes later"; the piece of matzoh hidden during the seder

**Seder:** "set order" of Passover service

**Matzoh:** unleavened bread

**Pesach:** Passover
